## RESOLUTION NO. 9417

### A RESOLUTION APPROVING THE MAXIMUM PROPERTY TAX DOLLARS FOR BUDGET YEAR JULY 1, 2022 TO JUNE 30, 2023.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Goose Lake has considered the proposed FY2022-2023 city maximum property tax dollars for the affected levy total; and,

WHEREAS, a notice concerning the proposed city maximum property tax dollars was published as required in The Observer; and,

WHEREAS, a public hearing concerning the proposed city maximum property tax dollars was held on February 23, 2022,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Goose Lake that the maximum property tax dollars for the affected tax levies for FY2022-2023 shall not exceed the following total:

Total maximum levy for affected property tax levies of \$66,089.00.

The Maximum Property Tax dollars requested in the total maximum levy for affected property tax levies for FY2022-2023 represents an increase of greater than 2% from the Maximum Property Tax dollars requested for FY2021-2022.

On the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of February, 2022, at a special meeting of the Goose Lake City Council, Goose Lake, Iowa, Councilperson Matt Cain introduced RESOLUTION #9417, and made a motion for approval. The motion was seconded by Councilperson Mike Schmidt.

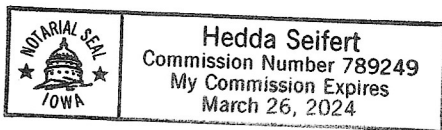
