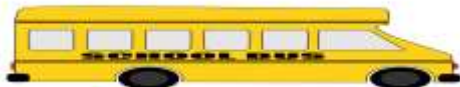

NEW WATER METERING SYSTEM FOR ALL GOOSE LAKE METERS

The City Council approved a new water metering system for the meters in Goose Lake. This system will allow the City to own and install all new meters and meters that need to be replaced. All existing meters that do work will remain in place until such time they do need replaced by the City. There will be no cost to the resident or business for the replacement of a regular sized household meter. Larger meters will still need to be replaced by the current owner.

All meters will have a new monitoring system attached. This monitoring system called an "endpoint" will allow the City Clerk to read the meter remotely and monitor the usage.

If there is excess usage for a person, that will show up on a daily report and the person can be notified in the instance that there is a leak and the leak can get repaired before the bill gets too high.

The new endpoints will be installed by Eastern Iowa Plumbing. There is no cost to the residents or businesses for the endpoints or the installation. The endpoint will transmit the water meter information to the computer through a cell tower. The endpoint will be installed on the outside of the house or building and a wire will be run to the inside of the house and down to the meter. The person doing the installation will then program the meter so it will automatically begin to read and transmit the information back to the computer of the City Clerk.

The City hopes to have all meters that need replaced and all endpoints installed by the end of November. If you know that you will be gone in the month of November, please contact the City Clerk so arrangements can be made to get your endpoint installed prior to that.

If you have any questions, please contact the City Clerk. The entire installation process will take about 30 minutes. The City Clerk will be contacting you to set up an appointment to have your endpoint installed on your existing meter and or have your meter replaced and a new endpoint added.

Again, there is no cost to you for the new endpoint or the meter should you need yours replaced. Please keep in mind, the new meters and endpoints will be the property of the City of Goose Lake.
