#### Possible Expansion of the Goose Lake Fire Department using City Hall Building

Mayor, Council, and City Clerk,

There has been discussion amongst the Volunteer Firefighters about a possible expansion to our current fire station. With room being extremely limited and more volunteers than we have ever had, we have been throwing around ideas on how to combat our issue. First, we threw around ideas of an addition to the east of our current fire station. Second, we discussed a completely new building altogether at a new location. Both of these ideas come with an exponential expense that is not feasible for our City.

With that being said, it was brought to the attention of our department that we could look into extending the rear of the station into what is now the City Community Center. This would allow us to have a deeper station that trucks could be "stacked" in the apparatus bay. To combat the removal of the current community center, which everyone agrees is a nice facility for our town, we would move the Community Center to the rear of the building where there are currently 3 vacant classrooms that had been rented from the City in the past. This would involve removing some walls and replacing the drop ceiling. In addition to making the new Community Center as nice or nicer than the current one, we would also investigate ways to update any AV hookups or other technology needed to potentially host classes, seminars, business meetings, etc.

There are many benefits to this idea and the low cost to remodel as compared to building would be the highest on the list. This project would be partially worked on by volunteers and finished by a contractor to make it even better than the current community center and fire station. I am looking for any comments or concerns from the citizens of the City of Goose Lake in regards to this idea. Any and all input is encouraged and appreciated. I plan on introducing this idea and having a more formal meeting in which citizens will be encouraged to attend in the future.
